EXTENDED DURATION PACK:-Camping/Hiking Backpack or A.L.I.C.E. Pack (preferably with frame) should contain all that is in

the 24 hour pack (or be worn WITH 24-hour gear), with the addition of the following items:
☐ Tent (one or two-man) or Shelter-Half - (optional, if you are sharing a tent with someone else who is carrying it)
☐ Sleeping Bag or Bedroll (appropriate to climate)
☐ Bag, waterproof: ○ Spare uniform, ○ Underwear and Socks, 3 changes
☐ 5 additional Meals (MRE's or similar food needing minimal preparation) ○ 8 Moist Towelettes, clean, in foil wrapper ○ Mess Kit & Camping Utensils (Fork, knife, spoon, can opener, etc.)
